# How it works



The Partnership Board meets 4 times a year for 2 hours.



Some of the 'core members' will meet beforehand to write an agenda of things to talk about at the meeting.



The agenda will be sent out to everyone 2 weeks before the meeting.



The Partnership Board will write a report every year about what they have done.
